# Curriculum

- Students encounter Hebrew as a living language by building on their everyday and holiday experiences, at home and in school.
- Students will engage in Hebrew reading and comprehension activities
- Key vocabulary is structured around the Jewish holidays and the everyday life of school and home
- Students will learn to participate in prayer with greater understanding and improved reading fluency
- A variety of comprehension activities will be utilized; including puzzles, cloze technique (sentence completion), true and false, and word/picture matches
